PROPS

A table with a bowl of soup, a bowl of rice, a lake, a jacket for Anansi, some rocks.

Music:ethnic African music from Ghana

(When the actors are ready, music off and stage lights on)

THE SCRIPT

Scene I: An African custom and Anansi Backdrop: A picture of Anansi.

THE NARRATOR

In Africa, if someone comes to your house, it is the custom to offer them dinner. Now, this is a story about Anansi. Anansi is a spider. He is clever, but greedy and lazy. Interpreter, translate clever.

INTERPRETER What's the magic word?

THE NARRATOR Abracadabra

INTERPRETER No! Try again.

THE NARRATOR Please.

INTERPRETER Correct.

THE NARRATOR Ok. Translate clever, please.

INTERPRETER Clever means listo

NARRATOR Greedy

INTERPRETER Greedy means avaricioso

NARRATOR

Lazy

INTERPRETER

Lazy means perezoso.

Scene II: Anansi's House Backdrop: Anansi's house

(Anansi is sitting at his table and is about to start his dinner)

ANANSI Monkey, I'm hungry.

MONKEY

Yes, yes, Anansi. Here is your food.

(Monkey puts a bowl of rice on the table)

MONKEY What's the magic word, Anansi?

ANANSI

Abra cadabra.

MONKEY

No! Say the magic word or I will tip this rice on your head.

ANANSI

Thank you, Monkey. Hmmm, this food smells delicious.

Enter Turtle stage left, waiting at the outside of the door.

(Turtle knocks at the door)

TURTLE Knock, knock, knock!

ANANSI Oh no! Who can that be? It's dinner time!

> TURTLE Knock, knock, knock!

ANANSI Alright, alright! I'm coming.

(Anansi goes to open the door)

ANANSI Turtle! How nice to see you.

> TURTLE Can I come in?

ANANSI Why?

MONKEY

Anansi, remember the African custom!

ANANSI Turtle, do you want to have dinner?

> TURTLE Yes, please.

(Anansi and Turtle sit down at the table)

TURTLE Hmmm,this food smells delicious.

ANANSI

Turtle! Your hands are very dirty. Go and wash your hands, please.

TURTLE

Sure.

(Turtle goes to the bathroom. Meanwhile Anansi quickly eats all the food. Turtle comes back to the table)

TURTLE Anansi, you have eaten all the food!

ANANSI I'm sorry, Turtle. I was very hungry.

(Turtle stands up and goes to the door)

TURTLE Anansi, come to my house for dinner tomorrow.

> ANANSI Sure!

TURTLE You too, Monkey.

MONKEY Thank you, Turtle. Bye!

Scene III: Turtle's House at the bottom of the lake Backdrop: Turtle's house at the bottom of the lake.

(Turtle is at the bottom of the lake, sitting at a table with delicious food on it)

Enter Anansi and Monkey at the side of the lake.

MONKEY Look! There's Turtle at the bottom of the lake.

(Monkey dives in and swims down to the table and sits opposite Turtle. Anansi tries the same but floats on the water)

ANANSI

I'm floating. I can't get to the table.

TURTLE Hurry up, Anansi!

ANANSI

I know! I will put rocks in my pockets.

(Anansi puts rocks in his pockets and jumps into the lake again and finally gets to the table.)

ANANSI Turtle, you've eaten all the food!

TURTLE I'm sorry, Anansi. I was very hungry.

(Anansi looks very annoyed.)

MONKEY Anansi, you reap what you sow.

ANANSI Lo que se siembra, se cosecha.
