



Summer Camp Leader

1 Individual task - Leader in a Summer Camp.

- Imagine you are a camp leader working with children at a summer camp. Make a list of rules about what children can and can't do and their obligations.
- Read them to the class and discuss

2 Pair work - Interviews for Camp Leaders

Student A: you are organizing an English summer camp for children. You are looking for young people to work with the children. You are offering a salary of 500 Euro for the month. Prepare questions for the interview.

Student B: you want to work as a camp leader at an English summer camp. Prepare questions such as, "What will I have to do?" and "How much will I be paid?"

3 Class discussion: Careers and Jobs

1 Brainstorm on the board themes to do with careers and jobs. Include: holiday jobs; voluntary work; qualifications; working abroad; salaries; job satisfaction.

2 Divide the class into groups of 4. Each group discusses the following issues, taking notes:-

- 1 Bad jobs
- 2 Holiday jobs
- 3 Salary versus job satisfaction
- 4 How to get the job you want

3 One member from each group describes the conclusions their group made on each issue. Allow students from other groups to make comments and ask questions.

4 Once all the groups have spoken, allow a class discussion to develop..
